



COUNTY OF SHASTA APPLICATION FOR PERMANENT VOTE-BY-MAIL STATUS

California law allows any **registered** voter to apply for the Vote-by-Mail Program on a permanent basis. (CA Elections Code Sec. 3201-3206). Once permanently enrolled in the Vote-by-Mail Program, you will *automatically* receive your official ballot in the mail for every election in which you are entitled to vote.

If you do not return an executed Vote-by-Mail ballot in four consecutive statewide general elections in accordance with CA Election Code Section 3017, your name will be removed from the Permanent Vote-by-Mail list. Your Voter Registration will remain active; but, you will have to re-apply for Permanent Vote-by-Mail status (California Election Code Section 3206).
