Presidential General Election – November 6, 2012 Military and Overseas Voters

Your ballot must be received **no later** than November 6, 2012, by 8:00 p.m. Pacific Standard time. **Postmarks do not count.**

Marking your ballot

- Mark your ballot using a ball point pen.
- Draw a single line to connect the head and tail of the arrow that points to your choice.



- To vote for a Qualified Write-In Candidate, write the person's name on the blank line provided. Draw a single line to connect the head and tail of the arrow that points to your Qualified Write-In choice.

Review Your Ballot

- You do not have to vote on all contests.
- Make sure you have marked your ballot completely.
- If you make a mistake you may get another ballot (EC § 14288) or you can draw a line through the incorrect choice and write your choice clearly.
- You can request a replacement ballot by emailing elections@co.shasta.ca.us.

Returning your ballot by MAIL if you received it by MAIL:

- Read and sign the Declaration of Voter on the envelope provided.
- Remove the stub from the top of your ballot.
- Insert ballot into envelope completely below red line.
- Fold down the top flap toward you along the DOTTED line to hide your signature.
- Moisten both glue strips completely then fold flap down toward you again.
- Press along both highlighted bars to seal the top and bottom of flap.

Returning your ballot by MAIL if you received it by EMAIL:

- Read and sign the Declaration of Voter (also the ID Envelope Fax form).
- Enclose the Declaration of Voter along with your ballot page(s) into an envelope.
- Go to www.fvap.gov/reference/forms.html. Scroll to bottom of page.
- Under Envelopes, click on the link "Open Postage-Paid Envelope" and print.
- Attach to the outside of envelope.
- NOTE: Under California State Law, your ballot cannot be emailed back.
- **When mailed from any U.S. post office, U.S. embassy or consulate, or APO/FPO mail facility, the Vote-by-Mail ballot return is postage-paid when using either the envelope provided or the form from the above FVAP website.**
- **You must pay postage if the materials are mailed from a non-U.S. postal facility.**

Returning your ballot by FAX if you received it by MAIL or EMAIL:

- Read and sign the Oath of Voter/ID Envelope Fax Form. **This form must be signed for your ballot to count.**
- Fax that form with your voted ballot page(s) to (530) 225-5454 no later than Election Day, **November 6, 2012**, by 8:00 p.m. Pacific Standard time.

Oath of Voter

YOUR FAXED BALLOT CANNOT BE COUNTED UNLESS YOU SIGN THIS OATH AND RETURN WITH YOUR BALLOT.

acknowledge that by returning my voted ballot by facsimile transmission I have waived my right to have my ballot kept secret. Nevertheless, I understand that, as with any Vote-by-Mail voter, my signature, whether on this Oath of Voter Form/ID Envelope Fax Form, will be permanently separated from my voted ballot to maintain its secrecy at the outset of the tabulation process and thereafter.

I am a resident of Shasta County, State of California, and I have not applied, nor intend to apply, for a Vote-by-Mail ballot from any other jurisdiction for the same election.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the foregoing is true and correct.

Warning: Voting twice in the same election constitutes as a crime.

**ID Envelope Fax Form &
Declaration of Voter**

I swear or affirm, under penalty of perjury, that I am:

1. The person whose name appears on the envelope, that I am a resident of the precinct in which I am voting, and reside at the address shown on the label; and
2. A member of the Uniformed Services or merchant marine on active duty; or an eligible spouse or dependent of such a member; or U.S. citizen temporarily residing outside the U.S.; or other U.S. citizen permanently residing outside the U.S.; and
3. I am a U.S. citizen, at least 18 years of age (or will be by the date of the election), and I am eligible to vote in the requested jurisdiction; and
4. I have not been convicted of a felony, or other disqualifying offense, or been adjudicated mentally incompetent, or, if so, my voting rights have been reinstated; and
5. I am not registering, requesting a ballot, or voting in any other jurisdiction in the U.S., except the jurisdiction cited in this voting form; and
6. In voting, I have marked and sealed my ballot in private and have not allowed any person to observe the marking of the ballot, except for those authorized to assist voters under the State or Federal law; and
7. I have not been influenced; and
8. My signature and date below indicate when I completed this document; and
9. The information on this form is true, accurate, and complete to the best of my knowledge. I understand that a material misstatement of fact in completion of this document may constitute grounds for conviction of perjury.
